

800 MHz ITAC MUTUAL AID FREQUENCIES

All fire departments operating in the 800 MHz band need to make sure the following nationwide mutual aid radio frequencies and squelch tones are programmed into all mobile and portable radios used by their department:

Also, please make sure the direct/talkaround mode for each of these channels is programmed in the mobile and portable radios used by your department so these channels can be used in areas where a repeater isn't operational.

It would also help tremendously if **all** 911/Dispatch Centers and EOCs are equipped with these channels too, especially those in Clayton, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry and Rockdale Counties. If the 911/Dispatch Center is in one of the counties listed above the radio doesn't have to be a super expensive base station. An agency can purchase an 800 MHz conventional desktop control station between \$450 and \$1,200 depending on the number of channels, features, etc. This price does not include antenna, antenna cable, power supply or installation.
